- 2. Jesus reply presupposes a high view of marriage.
 - a. Pharisees preoccupied with grounds for divorce; Jesus with the institution of marriage.
 - b. Pharisees called provision for divorce a command;

Jesus called it a concession to the hardness of men's hearts.

- c. Pharisees regarded divorce lightly; Jesus took it seriously.
- C. Justifiable Divorce
 - 1. Must go before an ecclesiastical court.
