# II. Exposition 2:1

- A. "Present your bodies"
  - 1. "Present" or "offer"
    - a. Greek technical term for a priest's presentation of a sacrifice.
    - b. Christians are priests I Peter 2:5
    - c. Verb is in the voice of command.
  - 2. "Bodies" incorporates our \_\_\_\_\_\_, our humanness incorporates our \_\_\_\_\_\_, and our flesh incorporates our \_\_\_\_\_.
    - a. Paul was very sober about the dangers of his own body. I Corinthians 9:27
    - b. Note Greek dualistic view of matter (body) and immaterial (spiritual).
      - 1. Led to great sin in the early church.
- B. What does "bodies" entail?
  - 1. Our minds

a. What we do with our minds will determine what we become as Christians.

## 2. Our eyes and ears

a. Note the allurement of secular culture to the eyes and ears.

#### 3. Our tongues

- a. Watch out for the tongue James 3:5-6
- b. Use the tongue to read scripture Psalm 1
- 4. Our hands and feet
  - a. Hands I Thess. 4:11-12; Eph. 4:28
  - b. Feet Romans 10:14-15
- C. "Living and Holy Sacrifice"
  - 1. Note Psalm 51:15-17
  - 2. Should we be offering God the leftovers of our lives? Malachi 1:8

## D. "Spiritual"

- 1. Greek is *logikos* translates into English as logic or logical
- 2. <u>Spiritual</u> may also be translated as <u>reasonable</u>. Both are possible translations.
  - a. It is reasonable to worship God with our bodies in view of who He is and what He has done.

## E. "Service of Worship"

- 1. Service *latreia* translated into English as *liturgy*. Technical term used of Old Testament priestly sacrifice.
- 2. Everything I do as a Christian may become a service act of worship.
