"Revenge – It's not the way to go" – Romans 12:19-21

I. Introduction

A. Illustration – vengeance.

B. Our text: Romans 12:19-21

II. Exposition

- A. Romans 12:19
 - 1. Literally, "Give place to wrath."
 - a. First: Let our enemy's wrath burn itself out.
 - b. Second: With the insertion of "God," leave room for him to exact retribution.
 - 1. More support for the second understanding.
 - 2. John MacArthur
 - 3. James Boice
 - 4. Law code to Israel
 - a. Exodus 21:22-25 (proportional justice)
 - 1. Perhaps not take literally.

Exodus 21:18, 26

- 5. Important Having received maximum mercy, be careful about requiring maximum justice.
- B. Romans 12:20

- 1. Paul is describing what 12:18 means.
- 2. Quoted from Proverbs 25:21-22
- 3. Two principle views

C. Verse 21

- 1. This verse qualifies all that preceded it.
 - a. Gracious responses in the face of hostility and evil honors God.
- D. What about Christian usage of civil court?
 - 1. Does not preclude the civil court, but beware of Christians taking Christians to court.
 - a. I Corinthians 6
 - 2. Always consult the ecclesiastical court.

III. Points for Reflection

- A. God's wrath is real and accumulating for all wrongs done except those covered by the blood of Christ.
- B. Be careful about expecting and pressing for maximum justice with your brother when you have received maximum mercy.
- C. When in the company of evil, seek the good, the beautiful, and the truth.
