- **Q.81:** Are all true believers assured all the time that they are saved and are in a state of grace?
- **A:** Since the assurance of grace and salvation is not essential to faith, true believers may have to wait a long time for it, and once they have it, their assurance may be weakened and interrupted from being afflicted by all kinds of *psychological problems* (distempers, original edition), from sinning, from being tempted, and from losing the sense of God's favor. However, the Spirit of God keeps believers from complete despair by never allowing them to be without some inner sense of his presence and support.

 - C. We all feel from time to time discouraged and perhaps like giving up, but faithfulness means keeping on.
 - D. Ephesus and the surrounding region was a place much like the circumstances we live in today.
