III. Points for Reflection

- A. Paul makes up three phrases to describe our position in Christ.
- B. "Made us alive together with Christ," in verse 5 means that we were experientially and spiritually dead and that we now live because of our union with Christ.
- C. "Raised us up with Him" means that we are creatures of the heavenlies, who are not bound by what we see, smell, taste, and touch. Our environment is different.
- D. "Seated with Christ in the heavenly realms" means that we have been transferred to be by His side.
