## Themes from Ephesians

"Seven Truths about the People of God" - Ephesians 4:4-6

## I. Introduction

- A. Studying numbers within Scripture.
  - 1. Not hidden codes or messages.
  - 2. Rather the use of numbers as employed by Bible authors
- B. Text
  - 1. The number of one is employed seven times.

## II. Exposition

- A. One Body, verse 4.
  - 1. Paul's remarks to Corinth. I Corinthians 12:21-26
- B. One Spirit, verse 4.
  - 1. Attention is upon what was done at conversion.
    - a. All are saved the same way.
    - b. Spirit as a pledge to all, Ephesians 1:4.
- C. One Hope, verse 4.
  - 1. Not hope in something uncertain.
  - 2. Hope is in something sure and certain.
  - 3. The church may be divided over many things, but has a unified goal.

- a. Barclay world redeemed for Christ.
- b. Lord's prayer Matthew 6:10.
- D. One Lord, verse 5.
  - 1. There is only one.
    - a. Yet, Christians easily want to divide.
      - 1. John T. McNeil
- E. One Faith, verse 5.
  - 1. There must be unity of the essential make up of the gospel.
    - a. One faith, Jude 3.
- F. One Baptism
  - 1. Paul is not concerned with modes.
  - 2. Baptism is a testimony to unity in Christ.
- G. One God and Father of All, verse 6.
  - 1. Paul introduced the concept of the Trinity in Ephesians 1:3, 5, 13 (Father, Son, Holy Spirit).
  - 2. In chapter four, he reverses the order.

    Why? Because he is arguing from the effect to the cause.
- III. Point for Reflection.
  - A. Unity
    - 1. Not at all costs, but we must be diligent to preserve it. Ephesians 3:4
