# Themes from Ephesians

"The Gifts that Christ Gives to the Church" - Ephesians 4:7-13

#### I. Introduction

- A. Unity
  - 1. Paul's emphasis
- B. All receive gifts but not the same gifts or the identical number of gifts.
  - 1. List of gifts: Romans 12:4-6; I Corinthians 12:4-6
- C. Key Text: Ephesians 4:7-13

# II. Exposition

- A. Verses 7-10
  - 1. Quote is from Psalm 68
    - a. God as victorious.
    - b. Jesus is identified with God as victor.
  - 2. Two points about these gifts.
    - a. If the gifts are dispensed by Jesus then they should be used for the purpose He intended.
    - b. Gifts are given to all Christians. Everyone has at least one.
- B. Verse 11
  - 1. Not an exhaustive list. Other lists found in I Corinthians 12:8-10 and Romans 12:6-8.

  - a. Apostles
  - b. Prophets
- 3. Evangelists
- 4. Pastors and Teachers
  - a. Pastors
  - b. Teachers
- C. Verses 12-13
  - 1. What is the purpose of spiritual gifts?
    - a. So that God's people become unified in faith and mature in practice.

### III. Points for reflection

- A. Every one of us has at least one gift. Are you using yours?
- B. The Apostles and Prophets were given to direct the growth of the church.
- C. Pastor's jobs are made easier when the sheep listen and obey.
  - 1. Hebrews 13:17; 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13
- D. Teachers carry a greater weight because they will undergo a more complex scrutiny than others. In addition, church members are responsible to learn and implement what they have been taught.
  - 1. Hebrews 5:12-6:1; James 3:1
