I. Introduction

- A. Giving up on things which are old.
 - 1. For most of us a difficult task.
 - 2. We do not adjust our comfort zone lightly.
- B. Adjusting comfort zones has a lot to do with how far we will grow spiritually.

 - 2. "Putting off" and "Putting on" understanding these terms as figures of speech.
 - a. Good: Job 29:14; Psalm 132:9; Isaiah 11:5; 61:10
 - 1. Illustration: Putting on a coat with a shoulder problem.
 - b. Evil: Psalm 73:6; Psalm 35:26; Psalm 109:29
