## I. Introduction

- A. Wearing the right clothes.
  - 1. Paul has already said Ephesians 4:22-26
- B. We put off and put on because it's already happened.
  - 1. Colossians 3:9-10.
- C. Key Text:
  - 1. Ephesians 4:25
  - 2. We are like Lazarus brought out of death to life. Old grave clothes exchanged for wedding garments. So why do we still want the corpse wardrobe?
- II. Standards of Character conduct.
  - A. Putting off lying verse 25
    - 1. Greek is *Psedos* (the lie).
      - a. Used by John in describing the Antichrist I John 2:21-23

  - b. Remaining silent often avoids martyrdom but it is what God wants?
- 4. Fear
  - a. Denying having said something for fear of consequences.

  - a. Placing ourselves in a better light than the facts support.
  - b. Buttering someone up.
- 6. Lying to God
  - a. A sin of the tongue
  - b. Annias/Saphria
  - c. James 3:6-10; Psalms 141:3
- C. Look at Jesus' life.
  - 1. The Pharisees try to catch Him in
    - a. Luke 11:53-54 a slip
  - 2. Jesus left the example to follow
    - a. I Peter 2:21-23

## III. Points for Reflection

- A. God is concerned about truth because truthfulness is part of his being.
- B. Our lying is most often the result of trying to protect ourselves from the gaze of others, yet God sees us at all times.
- C. Honesty may be brutal, but lying can never be condoned when we use it to protect ourselves.
