- E. Verses 16-20.
  - 1. Pharaoh's partial repentance.
- III. Points for Reflection.
  - A. Telling the story is the responsibility of parents and grandparents.
    - 1. What story are we telling our children?
    - 2. For the Jews, the story was that of God's redemption and the call to love and obey Him.
      - a. Deuteronomy 6:4-9; 6:20-25; Eph. 6:4; Col. 3:21
    - 3. Children must be taught the story.
      - a. Gen. 18:18-19; Deut. 4:9; 11:18-26; Prov. 22:6
    - 4. The Israelites did not teach it and one generation later:

a. Judges 2:10-11; Judges 17:6

- B. A word to parents: You must be good storytellers and you must tell the right story.
- C. A word to grandparents. You are still responsible to tell the story.
