 - B. The Text: Exodus 1,2, 11-16
- II. Exposition
 - A. Structure
 - 1. Verses 11-16 are an explanation of verses 1 & 2.
 - B. Verses 11-12
 - 1. Verse 11 is a reiteration of verse 5.
 - 2. Verse 12 contains a verbal play on words.
 - a. Pass over of the destroyer connected to the Hebrew pass over of their first born to Yahweh.
 - 3. Terms for first born and males are universal, and encompass man and animals.
 - C. Verse 13
 - 1. Donkeys and human children will not be sacrificed if substitutionary payment is made.
 - a. Donkey redeemed with a lamb.
 - b. First born males by silver.
 - 2. "Redeem" same word used of Israel's deliverance.

- D. Verse 14
 - 1. Children will ask in the future "What do these things mean?"
- E. Verse 15
 - 1. God killed the first born of Egypt but spared the Hebrews. Now their first born belong to Him.
- F. Verse 16
 - 1. "Sign" significant for sacraments.
- III. Points for Reflection.
 - A. We are not our own for we belong to God.
 - The Redemption of the first born sons harks back to Moses' early interaction with Pharaoh.
 a. Exodus 4:22-23; Hosea 11:1
 - 2. God has a right over his first born note importance of first born son.
 - a. God has a paternal right.
 - B. God wanted the Jews to remember their salvation came by way of a substitution as He wants us to remember our salvation came about through a substitution.
 - 1. Exodus 13:1-2
 - 2. Sons and donkeys.
 - 3. To redeem a son, a ransom payment must be made. a. Titus 2:14
 - 4. Note Jesus' parents and their adherence to the points of scripture. Luke 2:22b,23 (Ex. 13:1).
 - C. Let the child understand.
 - 1. Parents were being given teaching tools to insure that the next generation would know how, why, and from what they were saved.
 - D. We, too, have been redeemed by the first-born of God.

 - 2. We no longer belong to ourselves. I Cor. 6:19b-20a
