### IV. The Sin of Defrauding

- A. Differences between men and women

- 2. Greek APOSTEREO To rob, mislead with intent to cheat a. Mark 10:19
- 3. Also in Greek PLONEKTEO To over reach, covetous a. I Thessalonians 4:2-8

## C. Key point

- 1. Both words relate significantly to the topic of adultery.
  - a. Adultery begins in the heart Matthew 5:27-28
- 2. A Point of Sin
  - a. Enticing someone to have something he or she has no right to have and has no right to give.
  - b. Female attire or behavior.
  - c. Male infringement of touch and emotion in order to satisfy his own desires and to manipulate the woman.

- 3. Sexual defrauding does not pertain to married couples because each has a right to the other's body.

#### V. Points for Reflection

- A. The breaking of this commandment involves more than just physical adultery after marriage.
- B. The inability to make restitution for sexual sin means that this infraction of the Moral Law is more serious.
  - 1. It is forgivable by God, but the circumstances cannot be undone.
- C. We can promote sexual sin among us based upon how we dress and act.
- D. Sexual intimacy between married couples involves a sense of knowing that is beyond a mere activity.
- E. Loving God means, in part, learning how to possess our own bodies in honor which is an expression of our love and devotion to Him.
