"Laws of Retaliation" - Exodus 21:12-36

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Recent news regarding the sentencing of a convicted murderer. 1. Hung jury on the sentencing phase.
 - B. US Courts wrestle with denunciations of guilt and innocence every day.
 - 1. Sometimes, we wonder if justice has been served.
 - C. The Book of the Covenant offers some guidance.
 - 1. Many offenses noted, but far from all.
 - 2. Book of the covenant structure.
 - a. Begins with slavery Exodus 21:1-11
 - b. Next section various crimes.
 - 1. Capital crimes, verses 12-17
 - 2. Personal injury, verses 18-27
 - 3. Criminal negligence, verses 18-27
 - D. Reading of the text: Exodus 21:12-36
- II. Exposition
 - A. Capital Crimes, verses 12-17
 - 1. Crimes that require the death penalty.
 - 2. Verse 12 Murder one.
 - a. Hebrew "dying he shall be put to death."
 - b. Correlates to the Sixth Commandment.
 - c. Genesis 9:5b-6, Deuteronomy 17:6-7
 - 3. Verses 13-14 Crimes of Passion a. Involuntary manslaughter
 - b. Contrast with Ancient Near East culture.
 - c. God's way Cities of Refuge.
 - 1. Allowed for time of investigation.
 - See Num. 35:6-15; Deut. 19:1-3
 - 2. Note Joab I Kings 2:28-34

- d. Note how mothers (females) were to be protected
 - unlike Ancient Near East law codes. (Vs. 15)
 - 1. Hebrew term vicious assault.
- e. No slave trade, Verse 16.
 - 1. Deuteronomy 24:7; I Timothy 1:10
- B. Personal Injury, Verses 18-27
 - 1. Restitution is key.
 - 2. Masters are permitted to invoke corporal punishment, but no injury permitted.
 - 3. Protection for innocent bystanders, verse 22.
 - 4. Verses 23-25 Covered later.
- C. Criminal negligence, Verses 28-32
 - 1. Animals out of control.
 - 2. Distinguishing between an accident or an accident with a preventable cause.
- D. Lex Talionis The Law of E_____ E____
 - 1. Verses 23-25
 - 2. Famous because of the Sermon on the Mount. a. Matthew 5:38-39.
 - 3. Original intent Stop people from taking their own revenge and do not over punish.
 - 4. Sounds barbaric "eye for eye"?
 - a. Jewish understanding throughout the centuries.
 - b. Note translation concerns.
 - 5. Time of Jesus
 - a. The Law was being applied in the strict sense.
 - 1. Jesus refutes in Matthew 5:39.
- III. Points for Reflection.
 - A. Assaulting another person, who was made in the image of God, warrants death.
 - B. Do not make judgments, determinations, and rulings before you have all the facts. Remain neutral.
 - C. Be responsible with your property, possessions and animals so as to protect other people from injury.
 - D. Err on the side of "turn the other cheek" rather than "eye for eye."
