# Exodus – The Revealing of God's Glory and His Design for the Chosen #87

"The Dwelling of God" – Exodus 26:1-37

#### I. Introduction

- A. Contradictions in human behavior.
  - 1. Examples
  - 2. In relating to God, people desire to contact God, but when He is perceived near, they flee.
- B. Today's study
  - 1. Chapter 26 concerns the architectural design of the tabernacle tent.
    - a. Some skip this text.
  - 2. However, this text has much to say about God deigning "to dwell" among His people.
  - 3. The dwelling revealed two things.
    - a. God's character.
    - b. How sinful human beings may meet a holy God.
  - 4. The construction detail began with the interior as opposed to the exterior.
- C. Reading of the text: Exodus 26:1-37

## II. Exposition

- A. Exodus 26:1-6
  - 1. The innermost layer of coverings ten sheets of linen sewn together to make two coverings.
  - 2. Beautiful in color and included depictions of cherubim.
- B. Exodus 26:7-14
  - 1. The second layer made from goat's hair.
    - a. Typical of nomadic life.
    - b. Slightly larger than the linen coverings.
  - 2. Followed by two more layers of animal hide. Served as a waterproof tarp.
- C. Exodus 26:15-29
  - 1. Concerns the framing which supported the portable tent.
- D. Exodus 26:31-35
  - 1. Concerns the veil (curtain) that separated the Holy of Holies from the Holy Place.
    - a. Ex. 39:34; 40:21. A screening veil.

- E. Exodus 26:36-37
  - 1. The final covering was a flap placed over the doorway.
- F. Final thought on art depictions of appearance.
  - 1. No two depictions are alike.

### III. Special meanings.

- A. Old Testament meaning in view of context.
  - 1. The tabernacle was a part of Heaven on earth.
    - a. Ex. 25:8
    - b. God's throne.
    - c. Note significance of cherubim harks back to Genesis 3.
  - 2. It was a copy of the heavenly realm.
    - a. Hebrews 8:5
  - 3. A sad reality for the masses, there was <u>no</u> access.
    - a. Only the high priest could enter the Holy of Holies.
    - b. Jewish history on the thickness of the veil.
    - c. Note cherubim who blocked entrance to the Garden and Tree of Life in Genesis 3.
  - 4. The holiness of God is being highlighted.
    - a. Hebrew term for Holy to c\_\_\_\_\_ or s\_\_\_\_ First used in Ex. 3:5
    - b. God is <u>completely other</u> Ex. 15:11; I Sam. 2:2
    - c. The Idea of the Holy by Rudoff Otto, 1917.
      - 1. Quite a contrast to popular culture's view of coming in contact with "the holy."
    - d. Encounter with Jesus deity Mark 4:35-41; Luke 5:1-9
- B. The New Testament understanding
  - 1. David asked the thought provoking question, Ps. 15:1
    - a. Then came the answer, Ps. 15:2-5
  - 2. Yet, Jesus is the tabernacle John 1:4
  - 3. When He finished His work, the separating screen was torn asunder Matt. 27:50-51a; Mark 15:37-38
    - a. A miracle!
    - b. Perhaps an explanation for Luke's account Acts 6:7.
- IV. Points for Reflection.
  - A. The way has been cleared. We do have access.
    - 1. Hebrews 9:12,24; Hebrews 10:19-20
  - B. We even became the priestly class.
    - 1. I Peter 2:5-10
