- B. It beckons us to dependence.
  - 1. We usually want to do things in our own way and own time, John 15:4-5.

- C. It facilitates understanding our children.
  - 1. They are not born innocent.
    - a. Psalm 51:5; 58:3.
  - 2. Reminds us of why being a parent is so difficult.
- D. It facilitates our understanding of people and the difficulty we have getting along with one another.

- E. It facilitates forgiveness when wronged.
  - 1. Matthew 18:21-35.
  - 2. The key to holding on to relationships, Matthew 6:12.
- F. It beckons us to remember God's forgiveness of us.
  - 1. Each of us drink water at this reservoir every day.
- IV. Point for Reflection.
  - A. Radical depravity does not cause us to look down. It causes us to look up.
