

 - B. Two types of calling.
 - 1. General or external Matt. 11:28; John 7:37
 - a. Men, left to themselves, are unable to answer this call
 - 2. Specific or Internal Call
 - a. Regeneration (a Biblical term, Titus 3:5).
 - b. Regeneration involves a rebirth of the spiritual dimension of man that has been dead since the fall.


Review illustration of man's deadness.



- c. Texts which reveal regeneration (the inward call). John 1:12-13; 3:3,5; Titus 3:5; I Peter 1:3
- d. Signaled in the Old Testament as necessary for salvation – Deut. 30:6; Eze 36:26-27; II Cor. 5:17-18; I John 5:21; Eph. 2:1,5; Col 2:13
- e. We learn that we did not choose to become Born Again. God caused us to become Born Again, and we chose to follow Christ.
- f. Diagram on inward and outward call.


Outward Call
