I. Introduction.

- A. The doctrine of perseverance equates to the eternal security of the believer.
 - 1. Definition.
- B. Misconceptions.
 - 1. Perseverance does not mean Christians are exempted from all spiritual danger just because they are Christians.
 - a. Romans 8:35-39
 - 2. Perseverance does not mean Christians are always kept from falling into sin just because they are Christians.
 - a. Luke 15:17-18
 - 3. Perseverance does not mean that those who merely profess Christ without actually being born again are secure.
 - a. II Peter 1:10; Matthew 10:22
- C. Consummation of Paul's rewards as noted in Roman 8:29-30.
- D. Inconsistency among Evangelical Christians who do not hold to predestination but do believe in Perseverance of the Saints.


- A. Old Testament: Psalm 34:7; Jeremiah 32:40; Ezekiel 11:19-20
