#01 – "Introduction and Exposition of Hebrews 1:1-2"

- I. Introduction
 - A. Most people find this book hard to understand.
 - 1. This is because of its use of the Old Testament.
 - B. Authorship
 - 1. No salutary greeting
 - 2. Could be Paul Eastern Church view
 - a. Historical background
 - b. Calvin
 - c. Grammar is not Pauline.
 - 3. Could be Barnabas Western Church view
 - a. Tertullian supported this view (220 AD) but others supported Luke.
 - 4. Apollos a worthy candidate and not discussed much in church history.
 - a. He was a Jew and grounded in the Old Testament.
 - b. Alexandrian or Hellenistic Jew
 - c. Noted as a powerful speaker
 - d. Key text Acts 18:24-28
 - e. Apollos would have been thoroughly immersed in Platonism, Stoicism and the work of Philo
 - 1. Refuted Philo's view of time Heb. 10:10-12; 13:8 2. Stoicism – Heb. 2:18
 - f. Greater than priesthood of Aaron Heb. 5:1-10; 7:26-28
 - g. Greater than angels Heb. 1:4; 2:5-8
 - h. Greater than Moses Heb. 3:5-6
 - i. Greater than Philo's LOGOS -- Heb. 12:1-2
 - C. Occasion and dating
 - 1. Original readers read Greek and used the LXX.
 - 2. Gospel reported to them from an apostle Heb. 2:3
 - 3. Faced persecution Heb. 10:32-34

- 4. Persecution and expulsion from Judaism Heb. 13:12-13 5. Danger of falling away – Heb. 2:14-18 6. Greeting from those of Italy – Heb. 13:24 a. In all they were Jewish Christians who were Hellenized and lived outside of Palestine. D. Theme and Structure 1. Clear theme – "The Supremacy of Christ." 2. Structure Christ superior to the prophets -1:1-3Christ superior to angels - 1:4-2:18 Christ superior to Moses - 3:1-4:13 Christ superior to Aaron – 4:4-10:18 Christ superior as a new way of living - 10:19-12:29 Concluding remarks – 13:1-25 E. Date 1. Definitely first century a. Clement of Rome b. Repeated use of present tense when speaking of Levitical priesthood c. Sacrificial system in use d. Book mentions Timothy e.
