- Hebrews 2:14-18

I. Introduction

- A. Heresies in the early church.
 - 1. Two common ones
 - a. Jesus not fully God
 - b. Jesus not fully man
 - 2. The Nicene Creed
 - 3. The Westminster Shorter Catechism
- B. The writer of Hebrews settled the issue years earlier!
 - 1. His deity Hebrews 1:8
 - 2. His humanity Hebrews 2:10-18
- C. Today's text Hebrews 2:14-18

II. Exposition

- A. Hebrews 2:14
 - 1. The second Adam
 - 2. "Share" from Greek KOINONIA to have fellowship
 - 3. "He himself partook of same" METECHO "Taking hold of something". II Peter 1:4
 - 4. He is the second Adam I Cor. 15:45
 - 5. "Rendered powerless" the devil
 - a. Death is Satan's weapon.

Physical
Spiritual
Eternal
Death

- b. Defeated in three ways
 - 1. Conquered spiritual death
 - 2. Physical death does not hold people in the grave.
 - 3. There is no eternal death for the saved
 - Rev 20:13-15

B. Hebrews 2:15

- 1. A reference to the unregenerate state.
- 2. We no longer fear death Phil. 1:21; I Cor. 15:55
- 3. A. W. Pink

C. Hebrews 2:16

- 1. The author returns to his discussion on angels.
- 2. No help offered to them only the seed of Abraham
 - a. Genesis 3:15; Galatians 3:7

D. Hebrews 2:17

- 1. The high priest
- 2. Jesus as only mediator I Timothy 2:5
- 3. Made propitiation synonym for atonement
 - a. Expiation means sin is cancelled out while propitiation satisfies God's wrath.

E. Hebrews 2:18

- 1. God knows where we hurt.
 - a. Not felt needs.
- 2. God is not indifferent Psalm 103:10, 14
- 3. He sympathizes with the sinner.

III. Points for Reflection

- A. The seed of the woman destroyed the seed of the serpent.
 - 1. Gen. 3:15; Heb. 2:14-15; I Cor. 15:45
- B. The defeat of Satan also means the defeat of accusation brought by the accuser.
 - 1. Rev. 12:16-17; Rom. 8:33-34; Heb. 2:18
- C. How should we mourn for the departed?
- D. Death has been defeated, but do we live like it?
 - 1. Gen. 2:17; I Cor. 15:54-55; II Tim. 1:10
- E. We have confidence to face temptations because Jesus is our aid to overcome it.
