#13 - "Sabbath Rest" - Hebrews 4:6-11

I. Introduction

- A. Taking the knee
 - 1. Pastor Don and high school football practice
- B. The Hebrews' writer and the topic of rest
 - 1. "Rest" mentioned five times in Hebrews 4:6-11
 - 2. Spoken of earlier in 3:17 and the Promised Land
 - 3. Psalm 95 which highlights the complaining of Israel
- C. Today's text Hebrews 4:6-11
- II. Exposition
 - A. Hebrews 4:6
 - 1. In incomplete thought
 - 2. "To enter it" a reference to rest
 - a. Disobedience caused them to not enter
 - b. God promised to go before them, but they failed to obey.
 - B. Hebrews 4:7
 - 1. "Today" is timeless.
 - a. Rest is available now but not indefinitely.
 - 2. "Do not harden your hearts" once again a quote of Ps. 95
 - a. Immediate action is required.
 - b. II Corinthians 6:2
 - c. Keep in mind, the admonition is directed toward those in the church and not outside the church.
 - C. Hebrews 4:8
 - 1. Clear appeal to biblical history
 - a. Deuteronomy 12:10 and Joshua 22:4

- 2. The writer is using the Old Testament to build his theology of perseverance.
- The rest described is a rest from evil, sin and the world.
 a. Heidelberg catechism
- D. Hebrews 4:9-10
 - 1. The rest of Israel in Canaan was not the ultimate rest.
 - 2. The Sabbath rest
 - a. John Newton The emblem of rest
 - 3. Emblem or badge
 - a. Examples armed services, president, Pastor Don's class ring.
 - b. The emblem of the weekly Sabbath is packed with meaning.
 - c. Augustine
- E. Hebrews 4:11
 - 1. Hebrews 4:6 serves as an introduction to 4:11.
 - a. The intervening verses serve as a parenthetical thought.
 - 2. The writer's point: Let us exert ourselves to enter God's rest.
 - a. Paul Philippians 2:2
 - b. Remember *Rails to Trails* Pastor Don's last sermon of 2017.
 - 3. "So that no one will <u>fall</u>"
 - a. "Fall" is key This harks back to Psalm 95
 - 1. Kistemacher
- III. Points for Reflection
 - A. The opportunity for God's rest remains, but it will not remain indefinitely.
 - 1. Heb. 4:7; II Cor. 6:2
 - B. The Sabbath should still be observed.
