Luke 2:1-3

"¹ Now in those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus, that a census be taken of all the inhabited earth. ² This was the first census taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ And everyone was on his way to register for the census, each to his own city." Assyrians Babylonians Medo-Persians Greeks Romans Rome was hated because...
