#104: "Stay a Little Longer" Luke 24:28-35

#### Luke 24:28-35

"28 And they approached the village where they were going, and He acted as though He were going farther. <sup>29</sup> But they urged Him, saying, 'Stay with us, for it is getting toward evening, and the day is now nearly over.' So He went in to stay with them. <sup>30</sup> When He had reclined at the table with them, He took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, He began giving it to them. <sup>31</sup> Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight.

<sup>32</sup> They said to one another, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?' <sup>33</sup> And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them, <sup>34</sup> saying, 'The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon.' <sup>35</sup> They began to relate their experiences on the road and how He was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread."

#### Luke 24:28-29

# **Luke 24:16**

"16 But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him."

#### Luke 24:30-31

"30 When He had reclined at the table with them, He took the bread and blessed it, and breaking it, He began giving it to them. 31 Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight."

Insights in Luke #104

#### Luke 24:33-35

"33 And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them, <sup>34</sup> saying, 'The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon.' <sup>35</sup> They began to relate their experiences on the road and how He was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread."

#### Luke 24:32

"32 They said to one another, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?"

## **John 1:1**

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."

None of the disciples expected a risen savior because they did not believe the Word.

Hospitality is a neglected Christian virtue. It should occur more than it does among the saints. Jesus exercised divine authority in the disciples' home, and He should do the same in ours.

Insights in Luke #104 2

"Their eyes were opened," and the same was done to us.

# John 3:3

"3 Jesus answered and said to him, 'Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he <u>cannot see</u> the kingdom of God."

# Acts 16:14

"14 A woman named Lydia, from the city of Thyatira, a seller of purple fabrics, a worshiper of God, was listening; and the Lord opened her heart to respond to the things spoken by Paul."

Finally, note the gentleness of Jesus to Peter which is apparent between the lines of Scripture.
