## Insights from Luke

#105 – "He Stood in Their Midst" – Luke 24:36-43

- I. Believing in things that are hard to believe
  - A. Usually a word of exclamation
    - 1. "I can't believe it."
  - B. Most of our exclamations are over the unlikely, but not the impossible.
    - 1. Someone rising from the dead is impossible.
      - a. Scripps Howard / Ohio University poll
  - C. The disciples could not believe it either.
    - 1. Mark 16:11,13
    - 2. Yet, later they did believe it, and it remains central to the Christian church.
  - D. The text: Luke 24:36-43
- II. Exposition
  - A. Luke 24:36
    - 1. Jesus stands among them.
    - 2. "Peace to you"
      - a. Ancient Near East background
      - b. Peace is the first word spoken to the eleven.
      - c. He had said it earlier John 14:27.
      - d. Said to those who had abandoned him Ps 22:11; 31:11

B. Luke 24:37

- 1. "Startled" The disciples were gripped in fear.
- 2. "Frightened" used earlier in Luke 24:5
- C. Luke 24:38
  - 1. A mild rebuke
- D. Luke 24:39
  - 1. Jesus provides physical evidence. Also to Thomas.
    - a. John 20:27
  - 2. They recognize His voice but now sensory perception includes touch.
    - a. Acts 1:3; I John 1:1
- E. Luke 24:40
  - 1. Some version omit this verse, yet there is greater evidence for including it. John 20:20.
- F. Luke 24:41-43
  - 1. Jesus continues to offer proof by eating food.
- III. Points for Reflection
  - A. Jesus speaks peace to all of us.
    - 1. Luke 24:36; Luke 1:79; 2:14; Ephesians 2:13-19
  - B. Jesus' bodily appearance was not that of a ghost.
    - 1. Luke 24:41-43
  - C. Believing in the resurrection of Christ is not a secondary concern of Christianity. It is central, and there is solid evidence for believing in it.
    - 1. Luke 24:39
  - D. There are three reasons for Christ's bodily resurrection.
    - 1. I Corinthians 15:13-17
