 - 1. Those "who hear," verse 27 said this way because all are dead, unable to hear, until God brings them to life.
 - 2. Love your enemies.
 - a. Contrast with the world.
 - 3. Note three unnatural components of loving your enemies.
 - a. Unnatural deeds.
 - b. Unnatural words Rom. 12:14; I Cor. 4:12, I Peter 3:9
 - c. Unnatural prayers

 - 1. Striking the cheek and turn the other also.
 - a. Worldly way payback.
 - b. Old Testament Lex Talionis Ex. 21:23-26;
