Insights from Luke

#30 – "The Most Famous Picnic" – Luke 9:10-17

I. Introduction

- A. Picnics
 - 1. Pastor Don & Diedre enjoyed them years ago and still do.
- B. Today's text focuses upon the most famous picnic of all time.
 - 1. Near the end of Jesus' Galilean ministry He fed the 5000.
- C. The miracle's context.
 - 1. The disciples were weary from ministry, but the crowds could not get enough Mark 6:30-31.

II. Exposition

- A. Luke 9:10-11
 - 1. The retreat was interrupted.
 - 2. Jesus preached and healed.
- B. Luke 9:12
 - 1. They were located in a remote place.
 - 2. The disciples were actually telling Jesus to make the people leave to find food.
 - 3. They forgot God had provided in the past II Kings 4:42-44

C. Luke 9:13

- 1. Jesus commands them to give the people food.
- 2. Their response had been faithless.
- 3. There were five thousand men Luke 9:14
- 4. The cost would be staggering John 6:7.

D. Luke 9:14-17

- 1. Do not let familiarity with the story diminish the extraordinary nature of the event.
- 2. Illustration Consider the Sweetheart banquet.
- 3. Skeptic interpretation.
- 4. Attested in multiple accounts.

III. Point for Reflection.

A. God brings us to maturity by showing us our inadequacies and His sufficiency.

- 1. Note John's account John 6:7-9
- 2. God uses these events to show how inadequate we, in fact, are.
- 3. Alexander MacLaren.
- 4. "You give them something to eat." Jesus was alluding to II Kings 4:42-44.
- 5. Do not miss the total number of baskets: 12 one for each disciple.
- B. He is greater than all from the past.
 - 1. Elisha, but also note Moses.
 - a. A Solitary place a desert place. Mark 6:32.
 - b. Parallels the wilderness. Jesus is more than a second Elisha or Moses.
- C. "Who is this man?"
 - 1. Herod's question Luke 9:9.
 - 2. All through chapter 8, Luke has been explaining that Jesus is Lord over everything.
 - a. Revelation 4:9-11.
- D. Our utter sufficiency is in Christ alone.
 - 1. Note John's account of the miracle.
 - a. Passover was near Luke 6:4.
 - b. 1400 years after the Passover was celebrated as Israel entered the Promised Land and the manna ceased John 6:10-12.
 - c. Jesus' soon-to-be death would provide salvation from spiritual hunger Romans 1:16.
 - 2. He is altogether sufficient Romans 8:32.
- E. Always remember that His power is made known through our weakness.
 - 1. II Corinthians 12:9.
 - 2. Robert Morrison and the missionary enterprise to China.
- F. Never forget the post script to this story.
 - 1. Recorded in John John 6:22-66.
 - 2. After the big meal and the ensuing events, who was left? Only the disciples whom He called (John 6:44; 6:65).
