
Deuteronomy 18:18-19

II Peter 1:16-18

"¹⁶ For we did not follow cleverly devised tales when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but <u>we</u> were eyewitnesses of His majesty. ¹⁷ For when He received honor and glory from God the Father, such an utterance as this was made to Him by the Majestic Glory, '<u>This is</u> <u>My beloved Son with whom I am wellpleased</u>' — ¹⁸ and we ourselves heard this utterance made from heaven when we were with Him on the holy mountain."

"¹⁹ So we have the prophetic word **made more sure**, to which <u>you do</u> <u>well to pay attention</u> as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star arises in your hearts."
