"1 It happened that while Jesus was praying in a certain place, after He had finished, one of His disciples said to Him, 'Lord, teach us to pray just as John also taught his disciples.' ² And He said to them, 'When you pray, say: "Father, hallowed be Your name.

I Chronicles 29:11

"¹¹ Yours, O Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the victory and the majesty, indeed everything that is in the heavens and the earth; Yours is the dominion, O Lord, and You exalt Yourself as head over all." The structure is the same as in Matthew.

1. The first part is <u>vertical</u> and Godcentered.

2. The second part is <u>horizontal</u> which concerns us.

Two petitions for God

God's name to be hallowed Your kingdom come

Three petitions for us

Our daily bread Forgiveness of sins Lead us not into temptation
