Spirit of Christ insulates against the habitation of demons. 3. Self-help may become self-destructive. a. Moral improvement through self-improvement ends in no spiritual improvement. b. II Peter 2:20 **III.** Points for Reflection A. The dumb spirit took away the man's speech and the powers of darkness use the same ploy today. B. Unbelievers need to be confronted with the illogic of appealing to God for judgment while denying His power. C. There is no middle road.
  - D. Jesus' point in delivering the possessed from demons is that this proved the onset of the Kingdom of God. This was completely done at the cross.
