#43 – "How Many Signs Do We Really Need?" – Luke 11:27-36

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Selecting a presidential candidate (political leader).
 - 1. A lot goes into making a selection.
 - B. Similar concern in the first century for spiritual leaders.
 - 1. Jesus distinguished Himself through signs.
 - a. John 10:32-38; 14:11
 - C. Today's Text: Luke 11:27-36
- II. Exposition
 - A. Luke 11:27-28
 - 1. Jesus had just cast out a demon.
 - a. There was debate among the people was this the power of God or power of Satan.
 - 2. The mom's mom comment.
 - 3. Jesus uses the event to turn discussion in another direction.
 - a. Not a contradiction but a correction Luke 8:21.
 - B. Luke 11:29-30
 - 1. "Generation" majority of people living in Judea and Galilee.
 - 2. Story of Jonah also used earlier Matthew 12:39-48.
 - a. Emphasis is upon Jonah's <u>extraordinary</u> arrival at Nineveh.
 - b. Jesus draws correlation to His own <u>extraordinary</u> future work.

- C. Luke 11:31-32
 - 1. A second illustration from the Old Testament.
 - a. The point of the queen and Solomon is that she went much further to listen to the wisdom of a far lesser king!
- D. Luke 11:33:36
 - 1. No greater sign needed.
 - 2. The light and Christ
 - a. I John 1:5; I Tim. 6:12; Ps. 36:9; Ps. 119:105
 - 3. Verse 34.

- a. Matt. 15:14; 23:16
- b. Eye is "bad" PONEROS.
 - 1. II Corinthians 4:6
- 4. Verse 35
 - a. Strong warning
 - 1. When light is actually darkness Rom. 1:21-22, 25
- 5. Verse 36
 - a. The believer is enlightened I John 1:5-7

III. Points for Reflection

- A. The chief sign for all time is the resurrection of Christ.
- B. A life of growing obedience to God is a chief evidence for a regenerated heart.
- C. The normal response to the gospel is rejection.
