#45 – "The Woes Continue" – Luke 11:45-54

- I. Last week's message.
  - A. Strong and condemning words leveled by Jesus upon the Pharisees.
    - 1. Key texts: Luke 11:42,43,44
    - 2. "Woe" very condemning.
    - 3. There had been poor care of God's people.
      - a. Similar to Ezekiel 34:2b-4
  - B. Today's message: Luke 11:45-54
- II. Exposition
  - A. Luke 11:45
    - 1. Overhearing conversations from the past.
    - 2. Multiple cursing blows had just occurred.
    - 3. Awkward to be sure, but Jesus ramps up his condemning remarks.
  - B. Luke 11:46
    - 1. Who were the lawyers?
    - 2. "Burdens" Greek indicates massive burdens.
    - 3. Additions were being made to the Word of God.
    - 4. Legalism is a far cry from Jesus' heart Matt. 11:28-30
  - C. Luke 11:47-48
    - 1. Tombs Kidron Valley

- 2. Thought they were innocent Matthew 23:29-30 D. Luke 11:49-51 1. "Wisdom of God" a. God's counsel to send prophets. b. Examples 2. Apex of rejection – The cross. Matthew 27:25 E. Luke 11:52 1. Saving knowledge was locked out from the people. F. Luke 11:53-54 1. An abrupt end to the dinner party. 2. The response of the religious elite. a. Get rid of Jesus. b.
