## Insights from Luke

#53 – "Kingdom Growth" – Luke 13:18-21

- I. Introduction
  - A. Effective communication
    - 1. Several components are necessary.
      - a. Being clear.
      - b. Maintain central idea and repeat it often.
  - B. The central idea
    - 1. The kingdom of God is upon you.
      - a. Found in numerous texts: Mark 1:14-15; Luke 4:43, 6:20, 11:20, 17:20-21, Acts 1:3
  - C. Now, Luke adds two back to back parables.
    - 1. They stress the onset and growth of the kingdom.
    - 2. Text: Luke 13:18-21

## II. Exposition

- A. Note placement of these two parables.
  - 1. Included just after the healing of the woman bound by an evil spirit.
  - 2. Her restoration highlights the broader restoration of man's soul.
  - 3. Typical of Luke Parables in pairs.
    - a. A.B. Bruce

**Intensive Growth** 

- B. Luke 13:18-19
  - 1. Certainly resonates with the farmers.
  - 2. Not higher critic attack on veracity of the Scripture.
    - a. Mustard seed smallest in Palestine or smallest in the region.
  - 3. Keep in mind smallness of size of the seed and plant. The seed grows into a huge bush.
    - a. "Nested" birds.
  - 4. The kingdom's future size was not in the beginning.

- C. Luke 13:20-21
  - 1. For all the bakers among us.
  - 2. Leaven It seems at first inconsequential, being invisible.
  - 3. "Three peck measures" about fifty pounds.

## III. Further Insights.

- A. Point #1: Note risk while interpreting parables.
  - 1. More can be read into them than what is intended.
  - 2. Case in point Premillennial view of the kingdom.
    - a. Helmut Thielicke
  - 3. Philip Ryken
- B. Point #2: It all seemed so insignificant.
  - 1. Only few people followed Jesus at this time.
  - 2. Where was all the public display?
    - a. The Nazi's were great at public display.
    - b. J.C. Ryle.
  - 3. The kingdom <u>always</u> grows.
- C. Point #3: Leaven as a metaphor for sin.
  - 1. Jesus is not using the term in this context in relationship to sin leaven always does something It expands.
- D. Point #4: Tree nesting birds have a connection to the Old Testament.
  - 1. Ezekiel. 17:23; 31:6
  - 2. Nebuchadnezzar's dream about birds. (Daniel 4).
- E. Point #5: Intensive growth
  - 1. It affects everything.
    - a. Ryken, Kistemacher.
- IV. Points for Reflection.
  - A. The growth of the kingdom does not mean a Christianized world.
    - 1. Matthew 7:13-14
  - B. Be encouraged: If you belong to Jesus, you will grow.
    - 1. Philippians 1:6
  - C. World or national events always stand in contrast to God's Seed or God's leaven achieving all He purposes to achieve.
  - D. Sure hope for my own soul.
