- A. Luke 15:11-12
 - 1. Just the facts.
 - 2. "Wealth" Greek: BIOS.
 - 3. He did not want to wait for his father to die.

B. Luke 15:13

- 1. "Gathered all he had" Gk: SYNAGAGŌN
 - a. Liquidated his assets.
- 2. "Loose living" Gk: ZON ASŌTŌS luxury.

C. Luke 15:14-16

- 1. A spending plan, but not a running out plan.
- 2. A hog farmer for a gentile.

D. Luke 15:17-19

- 1. "He came to his senses."
- 2. Repentance Did not deserve the title of Son.
- 3. Joy in heaven over repentance Luke 15:7, 10.

E. Luke 15:20

1. Main theme – Lost, Search initiated, Joy when found.

F. Luke 15:21

- 1. True repentance.
- 2. No demands.

G. Luke 15:22

- 1. The first century view.
 - a. Works required before acceptance.
- 2. Hearers amazed a shocking display to the Pharisees.
- 3. Bringing the prodigal the best
 - a. The best robe worn only by the patriarch
 - b. The ring the family signet ring
 - c. Sandals a sign of grace, covering his creatureliness.

H. Luke 15:23-24

- 1. Robe & ring usually go the firstborn.
- 2. Fatted calf was to be saved for the firstborn's wedding.
- 3. The son was dead, but now he's alive.

III. Points for Reflection

- A. The prodigal son was lost before he was lost.
- B. We were all prodigal sons.
- C. When you are in the wrong, do not bargain with God. Return to Him on His terms and not your own.
- D. When we return home on the Father's terms, we find the loving arms of a dad who already had a plan in place to restore us.
