# Insights from Luke

#64 – "The Gospel Saves Us but Also Turns Our World Upside Down" – Luke 16:14-18

### I. Introduction

- A. Appearances can be deceiving.
  - 1. The people of God may look the <u>part</u> and act the <u>part</u> but are not the <u>part</u>.
- B. Old Testament condemnation for those who were not the part.
  - 1. Isa. 1:11-16; Amos 5:21-23; Isa. 29:13; Jer. 7:4, 8-11,16-20
- C. The Pharisees were outwardly the part but loved money.

# II. Exposition

- A. Luke 16:14
  - 1. They had just heard Luke 16:13.
  - 2. They believed material prosperity was a sign of spiritual success.
  - 3. If so, then Jesus failed the test.
- B. Luke 16:15
  - 1. This is actually a summary of false religion.
  - 2. Nothing like the real thing Romans 3:28; Gal. 2:16.
  - 3. The Pharisees love of money covered a more serious problem.
    - a. Justifying of themselves rather than being justified by God.

- 4. "God knows what is really in our hearts," Ryken.
- 5. Jesus calls the love of money an abomination.

#### C. Luke 16:16

- 1. The Pharisees used the law as a means of salvation.
- 2. 90% believe "God helps those who help themselves."

### D. Luke 16:17

- 1. The law will exist until the end of the world.
  - a. Matthew 5:17-18
- 2. The demands for right living, integrity, holiness and honesty, do not change.

### E. Luke 16:18

- 1. You cannot set aside laws on divorce.
- 2. The Pharisees changed the meaning of the law to make it easier to follow thus destroying it.
- 3. The law cannot be kept. That is why we need Christ.

## III. Points for Reflection.

- A. Compartmentalizing of the Christian faith always ends in the justification of sin.
- B. The Pharisees were lovers of money, but how do we know if we are, too?
- C. How do we force our way into the kingdom?
