Insights from Luke

#67: "What Is the Status of Gratitude in Your Life?" Luke 17:7-19 Often, however, our desire to praise God for His kindness is hinged <u>on what we think</u> <u>God owes us or has done or</u> <u>not done for us</u>.

Luke 17:7-9

"⁷ Which of you, having a slave plowing or tending sheep, will say to him when he has come in from the field, Come immediately and sit down to eat? ⁸ But will he not say to him, Prepare something for me to eat, and properly clothe yourself and serve me while I eat and drink; and afterward you may eat and drink? ⁹ He does not thank the slave because he did the things which were commanded, does he?"

Luke 17:10

"¹⁰ So you too, when you do all the things which are commanded you, say, 'We are unworthy slaves; we have done only that which we ought to have done.""

God does not owe us anything!

Luke 17:11-13

"¹¹ While He was on the way to Jerusalem, He was passing between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As He entered a village, ten leprous men who stood at a distance met Him; ¹³ and they raised their voices, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!'"

Luke 7:14

"¹⁴ When He saw them, He said to them, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they were going, they were cleansed."

Luke 7:15-16

"¹⁵ Now one of them, when he saw that he had been healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice, ¹⁶ and he fell on his face at His feet, giving thanks to Him. And he was a Samaritan."

Luke 7:17-18

"¹⁷ Then Jesus answered and said, "Were there not ten cleansed? But the nine — where are they? ¹⁸ Was no one found who returned to give glory to God, except this foreigner?""

Luke 7:19

"¹⁹ And He said to him, 'Stand up and go; your faith has made you well.""

Consider the three penetrating questions of Jesus. How is it that God becomes our servant instead of being our master? Thankfulness should be one of our foremost characteristics.

Life becomes more simple when we remember that God owes us nothing.
