Luke 18:15

"15 And they were bringing even their babies to Him so that He would touch them, but when the disciples saw it, they began rebuking them."

Luke 18:16-17

"16 But Jesus called for them, saying, 'Permit the children to come to Me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. 17 Truly I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child will not enter it at all."

Luke 18:18

"18 A ruler questioned Him, saying, 'Good Teacher, what **shall I do** to inherit eternal life?""

"19 And Jesus said to him,
'Why do you call Me good?

"23 But when he had heard these things, he became very sad, for he was extremely rich."

Luke 18:24-25

"24 And Jesus looked at him and said, 'How hard it is for those who are wealthy to enter the kingdom of God! 25 For it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God."

Luke 18:26-27

"26 They who heard it said, "Then who can be saved?" 27 But He said, "The things that are impossible with people are possible with God.""

Jesus' comment

"whoever does not receive the Kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it at all"

reminds us of our utter dependence upon God.
