#72 - "Is It Worth It?" - Luke 18:28-34

I. Introduction

- A. We all have doubts.
 - 1. Christians in various seasons of their life experience doubts about the faith.
 - 2. Doubts become greater when adversity is encountered. Is the investment worth it?
- B. Peter raised this sort of doubt to Jesus.
 - 1. Context The question arises just after the rich young ruler exchange with Jesus Luke 18:27

 - 1. How much do you have to leave behind in order to enter the kingdom?
 - a. Some think Peter lacks assurance.

 - 1. All-encompassing promise

- 2. Leaving family behind strange to us, but not in many regions of the world.

C. Luke 18:31-33

- 1. A question of worth. There is a shift from is it worth it for us to invest in the Kingdom to is it worth it for Jesus to invest (die) for us.
 - a. Yes. Note the active obedience of Christ.
- 2. Son of Man imagery Daniel 7:13
 - a. What did Jesus think the prophet saw?
 - 1. David Psalm 22:1, 7, 15, 18
 - 2. Isaiah 53: 5, 7
- D. Luke 18:34
 - 1. The disciples did not understand.
