^{••35} As Jesus was approaching Jericho, a blind man was sitting by the road begging. ³⁶ Now hearing a crowd going by, he began to inquire what this was. ³⁷ They told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. ³⁸ And he called out, saying, 'Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!' ³⁹ Those who led the way were sternly telling him to be quiet; but he kept crying out all the more, 'Son of David, have mercy on me!' ⁴⁰ And Jesus stopped and commanded that he be brought to Him; and when he came near, He questioned him, ₄₁ 'What do you want Me to do for you?' And he said, 'Lord, I want to regain my sight!' ⁴² And Jesus said to him, 'Receive your sight; your faith has made you well.' ⁴³ Immediately he regained his sight and began following Him, glorifying God; and when all the people saw it, they gave praise to God.''
