## Insights from Luke

#75 – "Making Wise Spiritual Investments" – Luke 19:11-27

- I. Introduction
  - A. This is a historical backstory that bears on today's teaching from Jesus.
    - 1. Background on Herod the Great and his successor.
  - B. The text Luke 19:11-27

## II. Exposition

- A. Luke 19:12-14 (Momentarily skip verse 11)
  - 1. The story bears a stark resemblance to what happened to Herod's son Archelaus.
    - a. Yet Jesus was speaking of Himself while using the historical context surrounding Archelaus as an interesting corollary to his teaching.
      - 1. Reasons for this parable being about Jesus.
  - 2. Note verse 11.
    - a. We can understand how this misperception came about.
    - b. Jesus corrects this view.
      - 1. We live in the "now" and "not yet."
  - 3. The parable has...
    - a. Ten financial officers
    - b. Not the same as recorded in Matthew 25:14-30
      - 1. Matthew's emphasis is on talent (giftedness) invested wisely.
      - 2. Luke's emphasis is on faithfulness in living and preaching the gospel.

- B. Luke 19:15
  - 1. The day of reckoning.
- C. Luke 19:16-19
  - 1. First tenfold profit.
  - 2. Second fivefold profit.
    - 1. Extraordinary. Note the Rule of 72.
- D. Luke 19:20
  - 1. The third failed to do anything.
- E. Luke 19:21
  - 1. Blame shift to the master.
- F. Luke 19:22-23
  - 1. Even on the servant's own terms, he failed.
- G. Luke 19:24
  - 1. Use it or lose it.
- H. Luke 19:25-26
  - 1. Fairness question raised.
- I. Luke 19:27
  - 1. The apocalyptic end.
- III. Points for Reflection
  - A. The one deposit we each receive equally is the gospel. What are we doing with God's investment?
  - B. Who is it that really does produce fruit?
  - C. We are being tested each day.
  - D. How do we understand works and rewards?
  - E. What about the worthless slave and the judgment?
