Luke 20:41-44

"⁴¹ Then He said to them, 'How is it that they say the Christ is David's son? ⁴² For David himself says in the book of Psalms, "THE LORD SAID TO MY LORD, 'SIT AT MY RIGHT HAND, ⁴³ UNTIL I MAKE YOUR ENEMIES A FOOTSTOOL FOR YOUR FEET." ⁴⁴ Therefore David calls Him "Lord," and how is He his son?""

Mark 12:28-33

"28 One of the scribes came and heard them arguing, and recognizing that He had answered them well, asked Him, 'What commandment is the foremost of all?' ²⁹ Jesus answered, 'The foremost is, "Hear, O Israel! the Lord our God is one Lord; ³⁰ And you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength."

³¹ The second is this, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." There is no other commandment greater than these." ³² The scribe said to Him, 'Right, Teacher; You have truly stated that He is One, and there is no one else besides Him; ³³ And to love Him with all the heart and with all the understanding and with all the strength, and to love one's neighbor as himself, is much more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."
