Insights from Luke

#85 – "Coming of the Son of Man" – Luke 21:25-28

- I. Review
 - A. Olivet Discourse found in Luke 21, Mark 13, Matthew 24
 - 1. Important and controversial
 - B. Assertions so far
 - 1. Luke 21:5-19 corresponds to Matthew 24:4-14
 - a. Entire section depicts the time from the resurrection until the second coming.
 - b. Some view as all future, but not necessarily.
 - 2. Luke 21:20-24 corresponds to Matthew 24:15-24ff.
 - C. Cautionary note: The diverse view on this section have led to divisions in the body of Christ. May this not be the case.

II. Exposition

- A. Luke 21:25-28
 - 1. Note correspondence with Matthew 24:25-31
 - 2. Possible views.
 - a. Pastor Don asserts that Jesus is still describing the events leading up to and including AD 70.
- B. Understanding the text.
 - 1. Consider the metaphorical language.
 - a. Also used elsewhere for "earth shattering" events.
 - 1. Isaiah 13:10; 34:4-5; Ezekiel 32:7; Amos 8:9; Joel 2:30-31; 3:15; Amos 5:18; 7:7
 - a. There have been many "Days of the Lord."
 - b. Blotting out of light with the result of darkness is an evidence of God's spirit withdrawing in judgment.
 - 1. John 8:12

- 2. The coming of the "Son of Man" runs through the Olivet Discourse and is associated with judgment.
 - a. Matt. 24:27; Rev. 2:5-6; 2:16; 2:22-23; Jer. 4:13; Isaiah 66:15; 19:1
- 3. Testimony of historians concerning AD 70.
 - a. Josephus, the Jewish historian AD 75
 - b. Tacitus, a Roman historian AD 115
 - c. Eusebius of Caesarea AD 325
- 4. Matthew's account Matthew 24:27-28
 - a. "Lightning" can refer to judgment in general
 - 1. Zech. 9:14
 - b. "Vultures" are the Roman soldiers.
- C. "Son of Man" coming, verse 27
 - 1. Tie-in to Daniel 7:9-10; 13-14
 - a. Describes the "Son of Man" coming to receive his kingdom.
 - 1. Matthew 24:30; Zechariah 12:10-13
 - b. Jesus conquered, rising from the dead, triumphant, but the old order needed to be destroyed to issue in the new.
 - c. Matt. 10:23; 16:27-28; Mark 9:1; Luke 9:27
 - 1. Some hearing his words would live long enough to see his coming.
 - 2. The coming of the Son of Man and the Coming of the Kingdom are synonymous.

III. Point for Reflection

- A. Jesus is <u>now</u> seated at the right hand of power.
 - 1. Eph. 1:20; Col. 3:1; Heb. 1:3; I Peter 3:22; Rev. 5:7
