#86 – "The Generation That Sees the Judgment" – Luke 21:29-36

- I. Introduction
 - A. Words that mean different things.
 - B. "Generation" Luke 21:32
 - C. Today's text Luke 21:29-36
- II. Exposition
 - A. Luke 21:29-32
 - 1. Parable of the fig tree.
 - a. Commonly used analogy.
 - 2. Controversy over the fig tree.
 - a. Some view Israel as the fig tree Jer. 24:1-10.
 - 1. Re-bloomed in 1948.
 - b. This is a stretch. Jesus includes "and all the trees."
 - 1. When trees are in bloom, summer is coming.
 - 3. Luke 21:32 "Generation"
 - a. Matthew 24:32-35
 - 1. Which generation? The one he was speaking to. a. Matt. 11:16; 12:41; 12:42; 12:45; 23:36
 - b. Note that Luke uses the term "generation" the same way throughout his gospel and the Book of Acts.
 - B. Abomination of Desolation
 - 1. Matthew 24:15-21
 - 2. Daniel mentions in Daniel 11:31 & 12:11
 - a. Initially a reference to the desecration of the temple. (II Macc. 6:1-13).
 - b. Jesus is saying the same sort of thing will happen again.
 - c. Could be the image of the emperor carried in front of the advancing Roman troops.
 - 1. The image viewed as an idol.

- 2. Early Christians took the sign this way and fled to Pella.
- 3. Matthew 24:31. Angels = messengers
- C. "Taken away"
 - 1. Matthew 24:37-42
 - a. The Greek verb airō.
 - b. The one is "taken away" to judgment.
 - 2. Matthew 24:37-39
- D. Luke 21:33-36
 - 1. Verse 33. Only the Word of God will stand the test of time.
 - 2. Verse 34. Dissipation, drunkenness, and the worries of life
 - a. Dissipation hangover
 - 1. Problem is not alcohol but drunkenness.
 - a. Psalm 104:15; I Timothy 5:18; Ephesians 5:18
 - b. Worries of life
- E. Luke 21 & Preterism
 - 1. Matthew 24:14

III. Points to Remember

- A. While my interpretative view of Luke 21 focuses on A.D. 70, let there be no doubt that Jesus is coming again to judge the world and save His people.
 - 1. Matt. 25:13; Luke 18:8; John 14:18; Acts 1:11; I Cor. 11:26; Phil. 4:5; I Thess. 1:10; 2:19; 3:13; 5:23; II Thess. 2:8; I Tim. 6:14-15; Titus 2:13; Heb. 9:28; James 5:7-9; I John 2:28; Rev. 22:12; 20
- B. The worries of life are a distraction that Jesus warns us may cause you to miss what really matters.
 - 1. Phil. 4:11; I Tim. 6:6-8
- C. Be about the Father's business is another way of saying be vigilant.
 - 1. Deut. 6:5-9; Eph. 5; I Cor. 7:32; Heb. 13:17; Luke 21:13
