#86: "The Generation That Sees the Judgment"

Luke 21:29-36

Luke 21:29-32

"29 Then He told them a parable: 'Behold the fig tree and all the trees; 30 as soon as they put forth leaves, you see it and know for yourselves that summer is now near. 31 So you also, when you see these things happening, recognize that the kingdom of God is near. 32 Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all things take place."

"Behold the fig tree and all the trees...."

Luke 21:32

"32 Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all things take place."

Matthew 24:32-35

"32 Now learn the parable from the fig tree: when its branch has already become tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near; 33 so, you too, when you see all these things, recognize that He is near, right at the door. 34 Truly I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things take place. 35 Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away."

Matthew 11:16

"16 But to what shall I compare this generation? It is like children sitting in the market places, who call out to the other children."

Matthew 12:41

"41 The men of Nineveh will stand up with this generation at the judgment, and will condemn it because they repented at the preaching of Jonah; and behold, something greater than Jonah is here."

Matthew 12:42

"42 The Queen of the South will rise up with this generation at the judgment and will condemn it, because she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon; and behold, something greater than Solomon is here."

Matthew 12:45

"45 Then it goes and takes along with it seven other spirits more wicked than itself, and they go in and live there; and the last state of that man becomes worse than the first. That is the way it will also be with this evil generation."

"³³ Heaven and earth will pass away, but My words will not pass away. ³⁴ Be on guard, so that your hearts will not be weighted down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of life, and that day will not come on you suddenly like a trap; ³⁵ for it will come upon all those who dwell on the face of all the earth. ³⁶ But keep on the alert at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are about to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."

Matthew 24:14

"14 This gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in the whole world as a testimony to all the nations, and then the end will come."
