- A. Luke 22:14-16
  - 1. Jesus deliberately planned for the supper. a. Luke 22:7-13
  - 2. "I have earnestly desired"
    - a. Emphatic, powerful emotion
    - b. Other times Jesus has displayed great emotion.
  - 3. Noting the history and meaning of the Passover holiday
    - a. The Exodus from Egypt
  - 4. The farewell feast would precede the suffering.

  - 1. From Passover to the Lord's Supper
  - 2. Luke records "two cups" in use.
    - a. Luke 22:17 and 22:20
    - b. Explanation
  - 3. Cup of Thanksgiving Eucaristeo The Eucharist.
  - 4. The traditional Passover employs <u>four</u> cups.

  - 1. The bread
    - a. The breaking of bread Jesus is broken for us.
  - 2. "Do this in remembrance of Me"
    - a. A continuing event
  - 3. Views of the bread body
    - a. Roman Catholic
    - b. Lutheran
    - c. Reformed
      - 1. Jesus' use of other figures of speech.
- E. Luke 22:20
  - 1. This speaks exclusively of the New Covenant.
  - 2. Covenants were always ratified in blood.
    - a. Exodus 24:6,8
  - 3. New Covenant prophesied a. Jeremiah 31:31-34
  - 4. The new aspect of the New Covenant is that it is grounded in Jesus' blood and no other.a. Matthew 26:20; Mark 14:23-25
- III. Points for Reflection
  - A. Christ exalted the Mosaic festival of Passover by changing it into His sacrament.
  - B. Jesus died in your place.
    - 1. Isaiah 53:5; Galatians 1:4; 3:13
  - C. The living presence of Christ in the Holy Spirit is realized in the sharing of Communion.
    - 1. I Corinthians 10:16
  - D. Even though we often fail to <u>earnestly</u> desire to be with Christ, He <u>earnestly</u> desires to be with us.
