#94 – "Jesus Tells the Truth, But They Simply Would Not Believe It" – Luke 22:63-71

I. Introduction

- A. People make judgments about everything.
 - 1. Critiquing is not necessarily a bad thing.
- B. By what authority people sit in judgment is another question.
- C. Today's text Luke 22:63-71

II. Exposition

- A. Luke 22:63
 - 1. The sequence of events.
 - 2. The abuse of Jesus.
 - a. Jesus predicted it Luke 18:31-32
 - b. Ultimate sign of contempt Num. 12:14; Deut. 25:9
 - c. Consistent with the treatment of the prophets
 - 1. Luke 4:24; 6:22-23; 11:47-50; 13:34-35; 20:9-16 John 4:44; Acts 7:52; Rom. 11:2; I Thess. 2:15; Heb. 11:37-38; James 5:10
 - d. Prophets foretold this abuse Isaiah 53:5
 - 3. Blaspheming, verse 65 Slander directed at God
 - a. Who is the real blasphemer?
- B. Luke 22:66
 - 1. Now the daylight trial.
- C. Luke 22:67-68
 - 1. Luke reaffirms Jesus' Godhood through his titles.
 - 2. "Christ" (First Title) means "Messiah" or "Holy One".

- a. Also identifies him as a king.
 - 1. Luke 23:2
- b. Luke states this from the beginning.
 - 1. Luke 1:32; 2:11; 2:25-26; 9:20
- 3. Jesus' response is that people are not interested in the truth.
 - a. John 10:25
 - b. Evidence is not the problem.
- 4. Verse 68
 - a. Hendriksen & Ryken
- D. Luke 22:69
 - 1. Jesus is the "Son of Man". (Second Title)
 - a. Used many times in the gospels Luke 9:22
 - b. Tie-in to Daniel 7:13-14
- E. Luke 22:70
 - 1. Jesus is the "Son of God". (Third Title)
- F. Luke 22:71
 - 1. The Sanhedrin confirms Jesus claim to be God.

III. Points for Reflection

- A. All aspects of Jesus' death were necessary in order to accomplish the full work of salvation.
 - 1. Isaiah 53:4-5; Hebrews 4:14-16
- B. The independence of men and hardness of heart may lead to incredible statements of unbelief.
 - 1. John 5:21-22
- C. "What further testimony do we need? We have heard it ourselves from His own lips." (Luke 22:71).
 - 1. Acts 17:30-31
