## **Luke 23:1**

"1 Then the whole body of them got up and brought Him before Pilate."

# **Luke 23:2-3**

"<sup>2</sup> And they began to accuse Him, saying, 'We found this man misleading our nation and forbidding to pay taxes to Caesar, and saying that He Himself is Christ, a King.' <sup>3</sup> So Pilate asked Him, saying, 'Are You the King of the Jews?' And He answered him and said, 'It is as you say.'"

# **Luke 23:4-5**

"<sup>4</sup> Then Pilate said to the chief priests and the crowds, 'I find no guilt in this man.' <sup>5</sup> But they kept on insisting, saying, 'He stirs up the people, teaching all over Judea, starting from Galilee even as far as this place.'"

### **Matthew 27:19**

"19 While he was sitting on the judgment seat, his wife sent him a message, saying, 'Have nothing to do with that righteous Man; for last night I suffered greatly in a dream because of Him."

### **Matthew 27:24**

"24 When Pilate saw that he was accomplishing nothing, but rather that a riot was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd, saying, 'I am innocent of this Man's blood; see to that yourselves."

### Mark 15:14

"14 But Pilate said to them, 'Why, what evil has He done?' But they shouted all the more, 'Crucify Him!'"

### John 18:37-38

"37 Therefore Pilate said to Him, 'So You are a king?' Jesus answered, 'You say correctly that I am a king. For this I have been born, and for this I have come into the world, to testify to the truth. Everyone who is of the truth hears My voice.' 38 Pilate said to Him, 'What is truth?'"

### John 19:4-6

"4 Pilate came out again and said to them, 'Behold, I am bringing Him out to you so that you may know that I find no guilt in Him.' 5 Jesus then came out, wearing the crown of thorns and the purple robe. Pilate said to them, 'Behold, the Man!' 6 So when the chief priests and the officers saw Him, they cried out saying, 'Crucify, crucify!' Pilate said to them, 'Take Him yourselves and crucify Him, for I find no guilt in Him.'"

### Luke 23:6-7

"6 When Pilate heard it, he asked whether the man was a Galilean. <sup>7</sup> And when he learned that He belonged to Herod's jurisdiction, he sent Him to Herod, who himself also was in Jerusalem at that time."

### Luke 23:8-12

"8 Now Herod was very glad when he saw Jesus; for he had wanted to see Him for a long time, because he had been hearing about Him and was hoping to see some sign performed by Him. 9 And he questioned Him at some length; but He answered him nothing. 10 And the chief priests and the scribes were standing there, accusing Him vehemently. 11 And Herod with his soldiers, after treating Him with contempt and mocking Him, dressed Him in a gorgeous robe and sent Him back to Pilate. 12 Now Herod and Pilate became friends with one another that very day; for before they had been enemies with each other."

A troubled conscience is God's way to lead men to light and life, but not a guarantee, because most prefer darkness and to remain in death.
