#97 – "Ominous Last Words of Jesus to the Jews" – Luke 23:26-31

I. Introduction

- A. Last words are always important.
 - 1. Jesus' last words.
 - a. Example: John 13:16,20,34; 14:16; 15:10-12
 - 2. Paul also had important last words for Timothy.
 - a. II Tim. 1:13-14; 2:3, 22; 4:1-3
- B. The crucifixion account and the importance of last words.
 - 1. Today's Text: Luke 23:26-31

II. Exposition

- A. Luke 23:26
 - 1. "Led away" a term with frequent use in the courts.
 - 2. Customary for a criminal to carry his cross.
 - a. Jesus and exhaustion
 - 3. Simon of Cyrene
 - a. Common Jewish name
 - b. Location of town
 - 1. Prominence in Scripture
 - 4. Jesus was born to die Luke 2:35; 9:22, 31, 51; 13:33
 - 5. He said he would be mocked Luke 18:31ff
 - 6. Used a parable about himself Luke 20:9-15
- B. Luke 23:27-28
 - 1. Information particular to Luke
 - 2. Jesus had a special connection to women.

- a. Luke's emphasis on "the outsiders"
- 3. "Daughters of Jerusalem" public mourners probably not disciples and city dwellers of Jerusalem. Designation often used of Israel (Micah 4:8; Zeph. 3:14; Zech. 9:9)
- 4. Female loyalty to Christ is not in dispute.
- 5. Judgment in view
- 6. Important last words
 - a. Take pity on yourselves.

C. Luke 23:29-30

- 1. "Blessed are the barren"
 - a. Shocking statement Luke 21:23; 21:20-21
- 2. Jesus prophesied Jerusalem's destruction
 - a. Luke 11:49-51; 13; 6-9,34-35; 19:41-44; 20:16; 21:20-24

D. Luke 23:31

1. Proverbial statement

Green wood \rightarrow Jesus vs. dry wood \rightarrow Israel

Which burns faster and results in a larger fire?

III. Points for Reflection

- A. Simon carried Jesus' cross, and we must do the same.
 - 1. Romans 3:23; Isaiah 53:4-5; Luke 9:22-23; 14:26-27
- B. Weeping for Jesus is misplaced emotion.
- C. Jesus' sober warning to the "daughters of Jerusalem" regarding a coming judgment reminds pew-sitters to take stock and renew urgency placed upon evangelistic outreach.
 - 1. Revelation 16:15-17; 9:6
