"The Seal of the Holy Spirit" - Eph. 1:11-14

- I. Introduction
 - A. Text: Ephesians 1:11-14
 - B. People's quest for news
 - 1. Paul presents in Ephesians the greatest news the world has ever heard.
- II. Exposition
 - A. A close look at God's call.
 - 1. Ephesians 1:11-12
 - a. Perhaps a restatement of verse 4.
 - b. However, emphasis is upon the goal of election, which is to make us heirs.
 - 2. The church is the new Israel, comprised of both Jews and Gentiles, Genesis 12:1-3.
 - B. Listening and responding to the truth.
 - 1. Ephesians 1:13
 - 2. What does it mean to hear?
 - a. Not just listening, but acting upon what is heard.
 - 3. "Having also believed" equals personal trust.
 - a. Process of belief: Notitia, Assensue, Fiducia
 - b. Grace and faith are gifts given and not found in natural man Ephesians 2:8-9.
 - 4. Faith enables belief Romans 14:23.
 - C. "Sealed in him with the Holy Spirit"
 - 1. Three senses on how a "seal" is used.

- a. Confirms an object.
- b. Mark as one's own property.
- c. Makes secure.
- 2. Each is true of us in Christ.

 - B. Also, Ephesians 1:13; 4:30.

 - 1. Deuteronomy 6:6-8
 - 2. The forehead: How we _____
 - 3. The hand: How we _____
 - a. Romans 12:2
 - D. The beast's mark
 - 1. Indicates ownership II Timothy 2:24-26
 - 2. Note the contrast between the children of God, and the children of the devil I John 3:10; 5:15.
 - 3. This contrast in marks applies to today and not just the future.
 - E. The number explained 666
 - 1. 3.
