Themes from Ephesians

"The Way We Were" Ephesians 2:1-3

Ephesians 2:1-3

"And you were **dead** in your trespasses and sins, ² in which you formerly walked according to the course of this **world**, according to the prince of the power of the **air**, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience. ³ Among them we too all formerly lived in the **lusts of our flesh**, indulging the **desires of the flesh** and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, even as the rest."

The first view is "I'm okay, you're okay."

The second view is - Man is not well and is morally sick.

The final view is the Biblical position which Paul is articulating to the Ephesian church. The diagnosis of man is that he is not sick, but dead - that is, dead as far as his relationship to God is concerned. He is helpless in changing this state.

Genesis 2:16-17

^{*16} And the LORD God commanded the man, saying, 'From any tree of the garden you may eat freely; ¹⁷ but from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that you eat from it you shall surely **die**.'"

Walking Corpses

This death is unusual because man remains physically alive. He appears to have all the signs of life, but he remains spiritually dead.

D.Martyn Lloyd-Jones writes:

"They think as the world thinks. They take their opinions ready-made from their favorite newspapers. Their very appearance is controlled by the world and its changing fashions. They all conform; it must be done; they dare not disobey; they are afraid of the consequences." (Boy, is this us!!)

We walked "according to the course of this world."

Enslaved by the Devil as well

"² in which you formerly walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, of the spirit that is now working in the sons of disobedience."

Romans 9:13-18

"¹³ Just as it is written, 'JACOB I LOVED, BUT ESAU I HATED.' ¹⁴ What shall we say then? There is no injustice with God, is there? May it never be! ¹⁵ For He says to Moses, 'I WILL HAVE MERCY ON WHOM I HAVE MERCY, AND I WILL HAVE COMPASSION ON WHOM I HAVE COMPASSION.' ¹⁶ So then it does not depend on the man who wills or the man who runs, but on God who has mercy. ¹⁷ For the Scripture says to Pharaoh, 'FOR THIS VERY PURPOSE I RAISED YOU UP, TO DEMONSTRATE MY POWER IN YOU, AND THAT MY NAME MIGHT BE PROCLAIMED THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE EARTH.' ¹⁸ So then He has mercy on whom He desires, and He hardens whom He desires."

The Bible is clear in depicting man as dead in sin, and not simply sick. The world dictates the mores of the ungodly, but the Scripture dictates the morality of the Christian.
