- A. Verse 12
 - 1. Formerly used exclusively of Israel. Now applied to all people who have been <u>called</u> of the kingdom.
 - a. Gen. 12:3; James 1:1; Romans 8:30
 - 2. Qualities of the believer.
 - a. "Compassion" very deep feeling.
 1. Phil. 1:8; Gen. 43:30; Gen. 45:1-4
 2. I Sam. 8:1; 20:4; 20:17
 - b. "Kindness" God is kind Rom. 2:4; 11:22 and we are to be like him – Luke 6:35.
 - c. "Humility" Maintaining a lower estimate of ourselves.1. Philippians 2:3.

- d. "Gentleness" not weakness. Willing to suffer rather than cause suffering. (Num. 12:3; Ex. 2:12-14).
 1. Aristotle.
- e. "Patience" a reflection of God's patience toward us "Longsuffering."
 - 1. Think of Jacob.
 - 2. Think of Hosea.

 - 1. Love heads the Fruits of the Spirit.
