## When We Pray, Pray This Way

#6 – "Bread and Forgiveness, Yes, But Do Not Forget Temptation" Matthew 6:13a

- I. Introduction
  - A. The challenge of Temptation.
    - 1. From the mundane to the serious.
  - B. Jesus' model for prayer also includes "temptation."
    - 1. There are many temptations that we face each day.
  - C. Today's text.
    - 1. "And do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil" Matthew 13a.
    - 2. There are three petitions in the prayer and this is the third.
- II. Exposition.
  - A. "Temptation"
    - 1. Greek meaning is neutral not necessarily evil. "Testing" or "Proving"
    - 2. Contrast to English "tempt" typically carries a bad sense.
    - 3. Theological matters
      - a. James 1:13; James 1:2-3; Genesis 22:1
      - b. MacArthur statement
      - c. Pastor Don's sense on the meaning.
      - d. A paradox of Scripture
        - 1. Trials or testing are a means of growth, while we do not desire to enter into them.
  - B. "Evil"
    - 1. Translation variant.
      - a. "Evil" or "Evil One" both are correct.
      - b. Calvin.

- c. The concern is over who is behind or encouraging all evil? Satan.
- 2. The assault on the child of God.
  - a. The devil Ephesians 6:12; I Peter 5:8
  - b. The world John 15:9
  - c. The flesh Romans 7:23; Galatians 5:17
- III. Insights on this petition.
  - A. A request to increase our S\_\_\_\_\_.
    - 1. We should be terrified over the prospect of sin.
    - No room for confidence in the flesh.
      a. Power perfected in weakness.
    - 3. This needs to be an important part of our requests to God because Jesus included it in His prayer.
  - B. Nothing the function of evil.
    - Satan Hebrew means adversary, however it can apply to a human being – I Sam. 29:4; I Kings 5:4; II Sam. 19:22
       A prosecuting angel – Job 1:6.
    - New Testament change with "Devil."
      a. Diabolos meaning slanderer.
    - 3. No definitive information on the origin of Satan or Devil.
    - 4. God is not the author of evil, but he does ordain it.a. Westminster Confession, Section 3.1
- IV. Point for Reflection
  - A. "Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" means acknowledging our utter dependence upon God.
  - B. All of us have weak spots, which without a guard posted, can lead to ruin.
  - C. This part of the prayer reminds us that we are engaged in a war 24 hours a day.
  - D. When we pray "do not lead us into temptation, but deliver us from evil," we also declare that we submit to His Word which is our protection from sin.
